**European Prize for young researchers in the field of

*"Fondazione Gino Galletti Neuroscience Prize 2009"*

**Regulations**

Art. 1. "Fondazione Gino Galletti", hereinafter referred to as the 'FGG', announces a competition for a prize of € 10.000,00 (ten thousand/00), to be awarded to a young European Union researcher who is the author of scientific publications on the subject of neurodegenerative pathologies leading to dementia.

Art. 2. The competition is open to citizens of Member States of the European Union\* under the age of 40 years on **31<sup>st</sup> December 2008**. Application forms should be addressed to the scientific coordinator of the FGG in person or by registered mail or e-mail with receipt request.

The following supporting documents must be enclosed with the application form:

1. A CV with a full list of publications;
2. Copies (paper or electronic) of the papers the applicant wishes to submit to the evaluation of the Committee of judges. Papers must have been published or accepted for publication (with proof) in the period 1<sup>st</sup> January 2007- 31<sup>st</sup> December 2008.

"Participation in the Fondazione Gino Galletti NeuroPrize 2009" should be indicated on the envelope or in the e-mail subject.

The name and surname of the applicant, date and place of birth, address for correspondence, and e-mail must be specified on the application form.

All personal data will be treated in accordance with the Italian law on privacy (D.lgs. 196/03, "Codice in materia di protezione dei dati personali", and subsequent amendments), and only to the extent necessary for participation in the competition and to allow the application to be evaluated by the Committee of judges.

Deadline for the application is **24<sup>th</sup> July 2009**.

Art. 3. The Committee of judges is composed of the FGG Scientific Committee (Professors Agostino Baruzzi (Chairman), Roberto Gallassi, Gerardo Martinelli and Pasquale Montagna), which may request the support of other experts. Committee decisions are final. In particular the Committee may decide to split the prize *ex aequo* between two or more researchers or not to award the prize if no applicant is deemed sufficiently qualified.

Art. 4. The FGG secretary will inform the winner by registered mail or e-mail with receipt request to the address indicated on the application form. It is the applicant's responsibility to notify any change of address.

Art. 5. The Prize will be awarded to the winner by the FGG Chairman or his representative on the occasion of a scientific meeting to be held at the Department of Neurological Sciences of the University of Bologna. At this meeting, the winner shall make a public scientific presentation of the results of his/her research. The date of the meeting will be notified to the winner at his/her address.
